## Learning objectives

This course aims at providing students a first approach to the Italian constitution and the basic constitutional principles. Learning constitutional law and the constitutional approach to legal issues represents the formative basis for all the other law courses and political studies. It aims at providing students with appropriate tools of analysis and argumentation in order to address the main debated issues of constitutional law

#### **Contents**

The knowledge of Constitutional Law is essential to understanding the foundations of the Italian Law and it is the introduction to the are juridical subjects.

The course has the main purpose the study the constitutional system, through the examination of the Italian Constitution in its wording and interpretations developed by the case law and practice. Particular attention will be paid to the historical evolution, in comparison with other democratic systems, the fundamental principles, freedoms of individuals, the sources of law, the Government, the role of the Judiciary and of the Constitutional Court.

# **Detailed program**

The course of constitutional law will deal with the following topics:

- 1. The State.
- 2. Historical developments of the modern States and Constitutions
- 3. Fundamental rights and freedoms
- 4. The Italian Constitution: origin, contents and fundamental principles.

The constitutional revision procedure.

- 5. The political system and its evolution
- 6. The Electoral Systems and political parties. Deliberative democracy and referendum
- 7. The Parliament
- 8. The Head of State
- 9. The Government
- 10. The Constitutional Court
- 11. The Judiciary
- 12. Regional and local governments.
- 13. The Sources of law
- 14. The Italian Constitution and the European Union

A detailed exam program for students attending the lessons will be given during the course, considering the topics discussed in class.

### **Teaching methods**

The course will be held through lectures, use of the e-learning platform and powerpoint presentations. The analysis of the current debate on constitutional problems as well as the analysis of relevant judgments of the Constitutional Court and other European Courts will constitute part of the teaching methods.

Accordingly, students should not be limited to the study of the textbook, but to understand the political and legislative events reported by newspapers and other media, and to take account of normative data and jurisprudence.

#### **Assessment methods**

Oral exam.
