INFECTIOUS DISEASES:

Etiology of major infectious diseases (bacterial, viral, fungal) and related clinical and laboratory typical signs for diagnosis and therapy.

Contents

Students will learn to apply their knowledge of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, to organ and/or apparatus pathologies.

They will also learn how to evaluate the diagnostic methods, generally used in medical practice, to recognize signs and symptoms of the main diseases, and interpret the results of instrumental and laboratory.
