Synthetic contents

The Semeiotic Course on Simulator carried out with practical exercises with dummies-simulators is aimed at the first learning of the techniques of approach to the patient and the main semeiological maneuvers to be applied in the objective examination, in preparation for the future professional activity carried out in the following years directly on the patient.
