Course title

Sociology of Education A-L

Topics and course structure

The course concerns in an introduction to the basic concepts of sociology, followed by the specific topics related to educational systems and institutions.

The course attempts to present a sociological approach to the study of society, with special emphasis to roles and functions of the educational systems in challenging times, where values and individual/collective behaviour patterns have been rapidly changing.

A selection of the most significant problems will be analysed:

- Foundation of the modern society;
- Main theoretical paradigms in sociology;
- Contemporary sociology: theories and programs.
- Values, norms and institutions;
- Social stratification, social inequalities and mobility;
- Challenges of the second modernity;
- Process and agencies of socialization;

- Problems of social cohesion and integration;
- Theories of education;
- Educational models and systems compared;
- Educational systems and social inequalities;
- The new sociology of education;
- Migrations, social integration and socialization to inter-cultural society.

Objectives

The learning aims of the course regard an area of ??basic knowledge and training activities in sociological theories and methodology. We consider the following goals as the most important:

- Achieve knowledge and understanding of the main sociological theoretical models related to the educational systems and processes, with particular attention to their socio-historical development in the context of the first and the second modernity, in polycentric perspective.
- Achieve knowledge and understanding of the main interpretations related to the definition of the social role of the teaching profession, in its social and historical perspective.

As for the aims related to the ability of the students to apply a specific knowledge and understanding in a professional context, the course devotes much attention to the formation of the following skills:

- Being able to use theoretical and practical knowledge related to the tools of observation techniques to understand the characteristics of the school environment, the subjects and their relationships, as well as dynamics of the learning process;
- Acquire ability of reflexive approach to their actions, identifying and analysing critically their teaching and educational models;
- Being able to produce an appropriate documentation in order to monitor their constant educational intervention with children and colleagues;
- Approve ability to create a welcoming and inclusive atmosphere that promotes the development of children, regarding their social and cultural capitals, and their different learning styles.

Methodologies

The course includes various teaching methods: long presentations and lectures followed by questions and answers, with participatory and dialogical teaching methods; use of audio-visual materials; seminars on specific topics held by experts, and by the students themselves; focus group.

Assessment methods

The exam consists in two distinctive tests: written and oral. Both parts of the exam are compulsive.

Both forms of examination may be held in English and Croatian/Serbian/Bosnian.

Evaluation criteria:

Written examination

- Relevancy of the answer towards the subject demanded;
- Ability to grasp the essential elements of the proposed subject;
- Ability to present the proposed subject in a coherent and consequential manner;
- Completeness of the elements that constitute the answer;
- Spelling and syntactic accuracy.

Oral examination

- Knowledge related to the topics analyzed in the bibliography and discussed in class;
- Ability to expose the proposed subject in an orderly and complete manner;
- Understanding and appropriate use of specific concepts relating to complex sociological phenomena;
- Ability of a critical thinking and reflection.
