Learning objectives

The course aims at building basic knowledge of legal orders:

- * the Italian legal order,
- * the Italian local government,
- * the European Union legal order.

In particular the course provides knowledge of the organization and activity of the Italian Government and other public institutions, and, especially, the European Union.

The course provides a juridical and political framework of relations between public authorities and individual rights too, with particular reference to individuals and social groups rights.

The course aims to introduce to the study of the legal sources and to the mechanisms of their production; it then focuses on constitutional changes .

Contents

The course aims at building a basic knowledge of the legal orders: the Italian legal order, the organization of the institutions of the Italian local government and the European legal order. The course is also directed to illustrate the relationship between individuals and institutions – national and European – with regard to the freedoms and the means of their protection. The attention is also devoted to the most relevant aspects of public economics law: regulation of the market and public intervention in economy.

The basics of general public law: the legal system, States and governments.

Sources of public law.

Outline of Italian constitutional history.

Constitutional organization of the Italian Republic.

Regions and local governments.

Rights and duties of the citizens.

International relationships of the Italian Republic.

Public economics law: regulation of the market and public intervention in economy.

Prerequisites

Knowledge of the legal sources of public law and the general organization of the Italian and European legal order.

Teaching methods

Lectures and seminars.

Assessment methods

Written examination for attending students at the end of the lectures; oral examination in the ordinary sessions. The institutions of Public Law must be presented with accurate legal terminology. The candidate must be able to explain and to critically discuss the rules and problems that pertain to Italian Public Law.
