Learning objectives

The course aims to offer basic knowledge of the national legal order, the Italian regional and local government and the EU-legal order.

The lectures focus on the organization and activity of the Italian Government and other nondomestic institutions, as the EU ones. The course aims also to analyse the legal and political framework of the relations between authorities and citizens, esp. referring to individual rights. Furthermore, it introduces to the study of the legal sources and their production mechanisms. Finally, it focuses on recent Italian constitutional developments.

Contents

The course offers basic knowledge of the national legal order, the Italian regional and local order and the EU legal system. Furthermore, it analyses the relationship between individuals and institutions – domestic and EU ones – referring to constitutional rights and their legal protection.

Finally, the lectures aim to discuss significant issues in the field of national and EU market regulation and public intervention in economy.
