Learning objectives

To acquire basic knowledge of basic principles of the Italian civil system and knowledge of structure and fundamental principles of the Italian civil law.

Understanding the application of the rules developing a basic ability to analyze a rule of law and to be able to analyse the application of the rule of law in single cases.

In Economics, Private Law course aims to give juridical knowledge to understand the importance and limits of private autonomy, both in social life and in a business activity.

Contents

The course contents are focused on the main features and objectives of the italian civil law.

Principal source of law in Italian civil system is the Civil code. Classes aims to study, mainly, the italian civile code and the most important laws.

Detailed program

The course consists of n. 9 cfu and the teaching period is in the second semester of the Academic Year.

The program is on the following main topics:

- 1) Introduction to the Italian civil law system (structure of the Italian civil code and relationships of the code with other sources of Italian civil law). Historical overview of the Italian constitutional system. Civil law sources. Hierarchy of sources. Implementation of EU law in Italy.
- 2) Subjects of italian civil law
- 3) Family law
- 4) Inheritance
- 5) Property
- 6) Obligations and contracts in general
- 7) Effects of contract law
- 8) Contractual remedies
- 9) Tort law
- 10) Consumers' law

Prerequisites

The course has no prerequisites.

Teaching methods

Classroom lectures, in italian language, with powerpoint presentations.

Assessment methods

Final exam is by oral examination at the end of the course. No intermediate exams during the course. Students should be able to answer correctly to 3 or 4 oral questions, to demonstrate their knowledge on private law and the use of a correct juridical language.
