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#### Course title

Moral Philosophy: Utopia and care for the world

#### Topics and course structure

Philosophy in its archaic sense, as the art of life. The issue of human nature and the human condition. Exploration of possible worlds.

#### Objectives

Developing: 1) reading and interpretive abilities; 2) capacity for autonomous articulation; 3) critical and dialectical skills; 4) self-awareness and formative abilities; 5) listening and dialogical ability in pedagogical/analytical context.

Lectures, discussion, seminars.
