Course title

From Marx's *Capital* to Althusser's *Ideology and Ideological State Apparatuses*

Topics and course structure

The course, after an introductory part on modern philosophy and the theoretical revolution that Marx made with respect to it with the discovery of the 'continent history', will analyze, in a first part, the fundamental concepts through which Marx in *Capital* provides a theory of capitalist society. In a second part, starting from the Marxian concept of reproduction, the Althusserian concepts of ideology and ideological apparatus of the State will be introduced, through which the persistence of capitalist society is explained not only by the repressive force of the State, but by virtue of a series of apparatuses, among which the school is undoubtedly the dominant one, which allow the dressage and the subjugation of the single individual to the dominant values ??in society.

Objectives

Stimulate the student's reflections on one of the most important analyzes of capitalist modernity, offering a series of conceptual tools that allow a critical understanding of the society in which they will operate as educators, showing the non-naturality, and therefore the modifiability, of the barriers and boundaries they will encounter.
