## **Prerequisites**

Nothing specific. A good knowledge of the basis of Psychology enables a more aware use of the course contents.

## **Teaching methods**

Teaching methods include the use of lectures, films and classroom discussions.

To implement the ability of applying knowledge and understanding the lessons include the participation of professionals operating in different contexts.

The dialogue with judges, solicitors, educators and social workers promote the ability of dialoguing with other

disciplines; the dialogue with expert psychologists upgrades the ability to apply the models in natural settings

All course material (e.g., slides, readings) are made available on the e-learning website of the course, so that also non-attending students can use it.

Learning is customized both for attending and non-attending students by the deepening of guided choice topics.

Attending students are allowed to attend the lab at the criminal Court of Milan.

Non-attending students are going to work on a court-case.

## **Assessment methods**

The achievement of learning objectives (previously described) is tested through an oral examination.

Both in-depth topic and lab-work are included in the examination.

Evaluation criteria:

- Accuracy and comprehensiveness of knowledge
- Language appropriateness
- Comprehension of the distinct traits of the discipline
- Competence in reflecting about problems of interdisciplinarity
