Teaching methods

Teaching methods include the use of lectures, films, classroom discussions, and practical exercises. Smartphone apps that allow students to respond in real time to open or closed questions will be used. All course materials are made available on the e-learning website of the course. An online forum will also be available on the e-learning website, allowing interaction with both other students and the teacher.

Assessment methods

The exam includes a written test to be performed in a computer lab. The test involves two parts: a multiple response test and open questions. The exam aims at ascertaining the effective acquisition of both theoretical knowledge and the ability to connect the different topics of the course. The answers to each question will be evaluated for the correctness of the answers, argumentative capacity, synthesis, ability to form links among the different areas, and the ability to present the phenomena critically. For students who request it, an oral interview will also be available on all the topics of the course. The interview can lead to an increase or decrease up to 10 points compared to the written exam score. The final evaluation after the oral interview will be compulsorily registered.
