Learning objectives

Grasp the essential dynamics of the firm and the foundations of its legal treatment. Understand the main contents and logics of the law of business organizations.

Contents

The Module A of the course offers an introduction to the rules governing the enterprise in general (including the small entrepreneur and the agricultural entrepreneur), and in its associated forms, such as partnerships and corporations. Some issues of competition and industrial law will also be covered.

The course examines the governance rules in the business enterprise and the basic legal principles governing the relationships among managers, investors, creditors, minority and majority stockholders, in light of the conflicts of interests which may arise among them.

Teaching methods

Lectures and problem-based discussions. Participation on a voluntary basis to a moot court competition.

Assessment methods

Oral exam.
