Learning objectives

The course aims to introduce students to the main topics of the twentieth century philosophical legal debate.

Contents

Students will be introduced to the fundamental concepts of practical philosophy, focusing in particular on the linguistic-analytic cut that will be given to the topics. It will focus on the connection between language and law, defining the language of law as an eminently pragmatic language. Subsequently, the essential features of the natural-legal, giuspositivistic, giusrealistic theories will be examined.

Detailed program

The course will be divided into two parts. In the first part, starting from the idea of rationality, the student will be introduced to the most widespread theories on nature of law (legal positivism, natural law, legal realism).

In the second part we will study some particular legal entities relevance in John Searle's theory of social objects.
