## **COURSE SYLLABUS**

## **Scientific and Medical Language**

#### **Aims**

The course will enable students to reach the CEFR C1 level ("Can understand a wide range of long, demanding texts, and recognise implicit meaning. Can express him/herself fluently and spontaneously without searching for expressions. Can use language flexibly and effectively for social, academic and professional purposes. Can produce a clear, well-structured and detailed text on complex subjects, showing a controlled use of organisational patterns, connectors and cohesive devices.").

#### **Contents**

The course offers an introduction to English for Academic Purposes with particular attention devoted to the medical field.

### **Detailed program**

Lecture sessions

Students will be exposed to the organization, writing and presentation of scientific research articles, lab reports, abstracts and posters. The module comprises theoretical aspects as well as several practical activities.

## **Prerequisites**

Non-native English students are required to possess an English language certification issued by an institution accredited by the University and corresponding to level B2 of the Common European Framework of Languages.

#### **Teaching form**

Lectures, applied language activities, group work, student mock conference

During the COVID-19 emergency, lessons will be recorded and available online, with some live events that will be planned and communicated on the e-learning platform.

#### Assessment method

The exam consists of a written test and an oral test. To have access to the oral exam, students need to pass the written exam.

The written exam (paper-based, approx. 60 minutes, pass/fail) will test the following 3 skills: Reading, Writing, Listening (level requested: C1 of CEFR).

The oral exam will test overall knowledge of scientific and Medical English. Specifically, attending students will have three partial exams:

- writing a research article: 40% of final mark
- writing and presenting an academic poster: 40% of final mark.
- peer reviewing a research article and an academic poster: 20% of final mark

During the COVID-19 emergency, the exam will be exclusively oral through a dedicated platform. Students will be sent the link to access the virtual classroom. Any changes to the exam procedures will be communicated immediately to the students via email.
