The course considers Visual Design as a language and analyses its structural and strategical principles.

Through analysis and 'deconstruction' of models of contemporary visual culture (film, video, graphic design, animation, plays),

students will have the opportunity to learn visual grammar and semantics.

Grammar: space, grid, graphic signs, sym-bols, typography and color.

Semantics: The meaning of the symbols, in-terdisciplinary relations and connections. Visual culture will be of particular im-portance: it is considered a heritage which inspires contemporary design.
