Learning objectives

The course offers a basic knowledge of criminal law's rules,

Contents

Special attention will receive the basic principles and rules of the criminal law (regarding the actus reus and the mens rea) as well as the sentencing and the execution of the sentence. In addition, the issue of criminal liability of social workers will be considered.

Detailed program

At the beginning attention will be addressed to the characteristics of the law in criminal matters in view of the constitutional principles in this area. Afterwards we will focus on the constitutive elements of a crime (the actus reus, the mens rea and defenses), as well as on the different ways of committing a crime (i.e. attempt and conspiracy). Considerations will be finally dedicated to the criminal sanctions system (including the phase of sentencing), in order to become aware of the prison system in our Country, with all its problems and inadequacies.

With regard to the single offenses, we will analyse assault against individual above all, with an emphasis on crimes against vulnerable people and gender-oriented. In addition we will take a look at the crimes which can be committed by a social worker while carrying out his tasks.

Prerequisites

There are no prerequisites.

Teaching methods

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Working group will be encouraged for the deepening of the most interesting topics. It will be organized a visit to a prison of the town and meeting with different professionals of the criminal justice system, like judges, lawyers, prison officers etc.

Assessment methods

Students attending the lessons can afford a written intermediate test on the first part of the studying program (the characteristics of the law in criminal matters, the elements of the crime, the sanctions). The success in the intermediate test allows students to lighten the load of the final oral exam, which will be limited to the analysed crimes against individual or will be replaced by the working group carried out during the course.

Students not attending the lessons will afford an oral exam on the topics addressed to in the handbook.
