Social Policy

Learning objectives

This course aims to:

- introduce students to key ideas and concepts in social policy;
- examine the delivery of social policy in different welfare regime types;
- provide an overview of the main features of social policy in Italy in a comparative perspective;
- discuss and critically analyze the development of social policy against “new social risks”;
- examine the development of social policy at local level.

Contents

- Key social policy ideas and concepts: social policy, welfare state, social needs and risks, bene
- The development of the welfare state
- The different welfare regimes in Europe and the main feature of the Italian regime

- Social policy provision against the “new” social risks
- The development of social policy at local level

Detailed program

This course introduces students to the theory and practice of social policy and welfare states. In particular, it:

- provides the theoretical foundations (key ideas and concepts) of social policy and the welfare state;
- explores the nature and extent of welfare provision in different European countries;
- analyses the main features of the Italian welfare regime;
- critically explore shifts in welfare provision and the nature of social policy responses to “new social risks”;
- examines the development of social policy at local level.

Prerequisites

Good logical reasoning ability; good comprehension and communication skills; basic knowledge of social work and social policy.

Teaching methods

This course will address these topics by reading textbook and additional recommended resources, by lectures and class discussions.

At times of lockdown during the COVID-19 pandemic lectures will be conducted in real-time by streaming. Lectures on specific topics will be recorded in advance and made available to students on the course platform.

Assessment methods

Written exam, with the opportunity to take an integrative oral exam.

The written exam contains:

- 5 short-answer question (definitions, concepts, theories)

- 2 essay-type questions.

Each exam, written or oral, will be marked based on the ability to communicate effectively concepts, theories and empirical evidence by using the appropriate scientific language.

At times of lockdown during the COVID-19 pandemic, exams will be conducted online.
