Learning objectives

The course aims at providing the students with the fundamental conceptual skills necessary for the examination and interpretation of the main phenomena in economic history of tourism. The ultimate goal is the acquisition of abilities related to learning, investigation and analysis, with particular reference to historical development of tourism. Students will be able to address the specific issues of tourism, demonstrating an understanding of their structural changes in the long run.

Contents

The course aims to illustrate the long-term socio-economic implications of a complex phenomenon such as tourism. The time period taken into account starts with the age of the Grand Tour in pre-industrial Europe until the full affirmation of mass tourism in the twentieth century, through the great transformations that occurred during the nineteenth century with the hydrotherapy, the discovery of the mountain and the role played by the first travel agencies in channeling towards the touristic destinations increasing flows of visitors, also thanks to transport improvements such as the railroad. The final part of the course will be devoted to a more specific examination of the Italian case with special regards to the recent changes wich followed the birth of the so called post modern tourism
