Learning objectives

This course aims to give a specific methodological preparation to select and conduct a case study. Student will learn how to study a single phenomenon or an individual unit (person or community), chosen according to appropriate selection and demarcation criteria and based on an intensive analysis, i.e. with the maximum amount of detail, richness and completeness.

Prerequisites

Teaching methods

Use of many methods, both qualitative and quantitative ones, in a complementary way.

Assessment methods

Students must present and discuss in class a case study chosen and developed during the course.

In the Covid-19 emergency period, exams will only be online. Students who follow the lessons remotely will have to comment on the readings uploaded to the platform and at the end of the course they will have to present, always remotely, a final paper that constitutes the exam. The exams will be carried out using the WebEx platform. in the e-learning platform of the course, a public link will allow any virtual spectators to access the exam.
