Course title

Chinese I

Topics and course structure

Introduction to Chinese language.

Lessons will concentrate on the basis of Chinese language, starting from the writing system and phonetics:

- Chinese characters: writing and classification
- Phonetics
- *Pinyin* Romanization system
- How to use a Chinese dictionary

Moreover, the course will provide the basis of Chinese grammar; listening and speaking skills will focus on recognizing tones and on basic oral interactions. The students will also be introduced to reading and translating simple texts.

During the second term, students will be required to read and translate newspaper articles abridged to an HSK2 level.

Programme and references for attending students

Modern Chinese language

Focus on learning to write and on the phonetics system, introduction to basic grammatical structures.

Chinese characters writing exercises, reading comprehension and basic translation techniques. The course will provide also guidelines to read and translate very simple texts. At the end of the course, the students will be able to introduce themselves and ask basic personal questions, reading basic text and searching for characters they do not know.

Assessment methods
