Course title

Foundations of Chinese Culture

Topics and course structure

The main aim of the course is to provide useful tools to understand China and the contemporary Sinophone world through the acquisition of fundamental knowledge on the evolution of the history, the systems of thought, the cultural dynamics as well as the social, political and institutional structures of the country from its origins to the present day.

The course is divided into 2 modules one on traditional culture, and another on modern culture and 21st century China

The first module traces a general profile of the historical and cultural evolution of the period from pre-imperial China to the Opium Wars, with a special focus on the construction of the idea of "Chineseness", from the origins of the writing system to the foundations of the philosophical and literary heritage.

The second module, on the other hand, focuses on the analysis of the changes that have taken place in China following the encounter / clash with the West and follows the profound historical transformations that, throughout the twentieth century, have led the country to achieve the current status as a great world power. The basic knowledge acquired through the course will be used to analyze the main characteristics of the political and government system of the People's Republic of China, promoting the study of issues related to the main cultural, political and economic spheres of China in the 21st century. Furthermore, in this second module, students will be introduced to the concepts of the Sinophone and Sinophone studies which examine Chinese language and culture outside the geographical borders of China: in Southeast Asia, North America, but also in Peru and Europe.

Objectives

The course aims to provide the basic competences and fundamental skills necessary for the study and understanding of Chinese culture and the Sinophone world. At the end of the course, students will be able to navigate through Chinese history and to develop logical connections among the topics covered. Furthermore, learners are expected to acquire a good knowledge of the historical evolution of the Chinese world from ancient times to the present day and are expected to be able to analyze the main historical events, by contextualizing them both over time and vis-à-vis Chinese society.

Additionally, students will develop critical skills and communication skills through participation in debates, seminars and other activities
