Aims

Aims

The Oncology's clerkship aims to provide to the students the principles and the clinical approach the patient affected by solid tumors. In particular, the student will be trained to interpret the signs, symptoms and laboratory data that characterize:

- Early and metastatic breast cancer
- Early and metastatic gastro-intestinal cancer
- Early and metastatic genito-urinary cancer
- Early and metastatic melanoma
- Early and metastatic lung cancer

Moreover, the students will be introduced to the principle and management of cancer genetics (particularly in case of hereditary breast cancer) and to the knowledge and management of the main relevant emergencies in oncology.

Finally, the student will be exposed to the knowledge

of the main standard anti-cancer treatments and of the most relevant innovative diagnostics and therapeutics, including:

- Genomics for prognosis and prediction

- Immunotherapies and targeted therapies
