During the first meeting, reference will be made to the context in which palliative care are inscribed, to whom these are addressed, how these are provided on our territory. Examples will be borrowed from clinical experience in order to better explain the use of drugs and for which routes of administration in palliative care. Particular attention will be paid to the use of drugs for sedation.

During the second meeting we will talk about the communication of bad news to patients and their families and how to deal with these issues as a team.

The third meeting will have the aim of discussing the end-of-life ethics issue, as well as the planning of end-of-life care.

The theme of spirituality will also be discussed.
