Learning objectives

First of all, this course of Parliamentary Law intends to provide the students a summary of the most important political-parliamentary events of our national history, and then to analyse the position of the Parliament in the republican constitutional system and its functions in the government system.

Contents

A special attention is attributed to subjects as bicameralism, also in an historical and comparative vision, parliamentary rules, privileges of Parliament, clauses of disqualification and incompatibility cases, practice of ordinary and constitutional statutes, committee of inquiry, evolution of our political system after the change of electoral law by referendum.

Given the purpose of the course, students will be required to know the most important news events proposed by the political-parliamentary, even in light of discussions on those topics will be set to lesson.
