# Learning objectives

#### **Contents**

The course focuses on general rules of criminal law, through the study of the elements of crime, by comparing provisions and jurisprudence. Attention will be drawn also to the system of sanctions and to the main offenses against individual, which are part of the final examination.

#### **Detailed program**

The Italian criminal law system: a general framework. Constitutional principles in criminal matter. Elements of crime: general principles. Physical element, criminal defences, mens rea. Attempt, complicity in a crime. Criminal and administrative sanctions.

Crimes against individual.

#### **Prerequisites**

Students need to have passed the exam of Constitutional law.

### **Teaching methods**

The course will be developed by face-to-face classes; o

The course will have an important practical dimension: the study of criminal institutions and rules will be matched by the discussion of case-law, handled in advance by students, through individual or group activities.

#### **Assessment methods**

Oral exam, inclusive of module A and module B.

Students attending the lessons and taking part on the activities proposed during the course, including working groups, will receive a final evaluation which may permit them to avoid the oral exam.
