Learning objectives

The course aims at teaching the basic structures of Spanish morpho-syntax. The course will provide elements of phonetics and vocabulary to help students read and understand texts in Spanish, as well as to allow them to achieve a correct linguistic interaction. The course will also further students' acquisition of basic communicative and discursive skills in Spanish and introduce them to the main aspects concerning culture and civilization in Spanish-speaking countries.

Contents

Grammar, communicative and socio-cultural contents.

The grammar and communicative contents of the course correspond to a B1 proficiency level according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

Communicative skills:

The communicative contents concern the skills necessary for an adequate oral and written linguistic interaction of the required linguistic level. Precise information will be uploaded to the course's e-learning platform.

Social and cultural contents:

Prerequisites

No previous language proficiency level is required.

Teaching methods

Grammar exercise lessons and lectures.

Assessment methods

The exam consists of two parts:

1. A written test on grammar. The written test is preliminary to the oral exam.

2. An oral exam concerning the socio-cultural topics discussed in class in order to evaluate students' oral expression skills.

During the Covid-19 emergency period, all tests will be organized completely online. The written test will be carried out on a specific platform, whereas the oral test will be organized as a video-conference using WebEx; the e-learning page of the course will provide a public link which allows for participation of virtual audience.
