#### **Learning objectives**

The course aims at providing the students with the fundamental conceptual skills necessary for the examination and interpretation of the main phenomena in economic history. The ultimate goal is the acquisition of abilities related to learning, investigation and analysis, with particular reference to historical development of economic systems. Students will be able to address the specific issues of economic systems, demonstrating an understanding of their structural changes in the long run

#### **Contents**

The course provides the basic elements of historical-economic research, focusing on the reasons of development in a long run perspective starting from the features of economy in preindustrial period onward with special regards to the industrial revolution and industrious revolution, the second industrial revolution, the XXth century economy, the main economic issues nowadays. The final part of the course will deal with the Italian case of development

#### **Detailed program**

1. The historical method
2. The “mystery” of development
3. The interplay between man and environment: population and cities
4. Technological progress from early modern period onward: agriculture, industry and trade
5. Money, the financial and credit system, the forms of enterprise

6. Who has left behind: the case of Africa
7. The economy nowadays
8. The Italian case of development

Basic knowledge of the historical and political events (XVIIIth-XXth centuries)
