Learning objectives

The course provides students with basics concepts of the constitutional law and leads them to a complete knowledge of the text of the Italian Constitution.

The course also aims to provide students with essential principles of Private Labour Law.

Contents

The course covers the entire Italian Constitutional Law (fundamental rights and public powers' organization), seen also in the perspective of European integration, and an outline of Administrative Law.

The part of labour law takes into account the rules of the employment contract.

Detailed program

Constitutional law: 1. Introduction. The State as a legal system and its forms. 2. The Italian Constitution: birth, implementation, revision. 3. The system of the sources of law. 4. The international and European dimension of the system of sources of law. 5. The exercise of popular sovereignty: representative and direct democracy 6. The

forms of government. 7. The Constitutional organisation: Government, President of the Republic, Parliament, Constitutional Court, Judiciary. 8. The constitutional principles on the public administration. 9. The fundamental Rights 10. The Economic Constitution.

Labour Law: 1. Subordinate and autonomous works. 2. Employees' duties. 3. Employer's powers. 4. Working time. 5. The wage. 6. Dismissal and redundancies. 7. Atypical work.

Prerequisites

Knowledge of the Italian language.

Teaching methods

Lectures
