## COURSE SYLLABUS

### Public International Law

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#### Learning objectives

The course aims at providing the students with the knowledge and critical understanding of the main aspects of the system of international law in its historical evolution and present situation, with particular emphasis on the crucial question of the use of force and the maintenance of international peace and security.

#### Contents

- Fundamental aspects, subjects and historical evolution of international law;
- Maintenance of international peace and security and the use of force;
- Treaties;
- Custom;
- International responsibility;
- International law and domestic law.

#### Detailed program

The course, which is articulated according to the subjects indicated under the entry "contents", takes into consideration, first of all, the substantive aspects of international law, in particular whether it is today sufficiently developed to ensure the maintenance of international peace and security through the United Nations system. The formal aspects of international law are subsequently taken into consideration, through the analysis of the

categories of rules (treaties, custom, other categories), the consequences of wrongful acts (international responsibility) and the relationship between international law and Italian domestic law.

## **Prerequisites**

To address the part of the course relating to the relationship between international law and domestic law, the students should have passed the exam of constitutional law.

## **Teaching methods**

Subject to what provided hereunder, classes will be front classes in presence.

In the covid-19 emergency period, classes will be previously recorded and made available online. Oral exams will be held only online using the webex platform. On the e-learning page of the course a public link will be made available for access to virtual attendees.
