#### Learning area

#### Learning objectives

Students will acquire knowledge of media law, internet law and computer crime law.

#### Contents

The course is divided in two parts: the first part is focused on the relevant principles of constitutional and public law (division of powers, law's sources, judiciary and protection of rights), freedom of speech, media law, internet law, privacy, copyright and advertising. In the second part, the basics of criminal laws are explained, and the laws regarding computer crimes in the Italian criminal law are analysed.

#### Detailed program

##### Part One

1. Introduction to public and constitutional law: the Constitution, the division of the powers, the judiciary , the Constitutional Court, national and international protection of human rights.
2. The freedom of speech (art. 21 Const.): constitutional and supranational regulation; restrictions; right to inform, right of criticize, freedom of satire
