Psychology of Disability and integration

Topics and course structure

The Psychology of Disability and integration course is focused on the topics of disability and integration from a theoretical and methodological point of view. In detail, the following issues will be discussed: Definitions of disability and developmental disorders, general frameworks for assessing disabilities, skills, and knowledge for professional educators, social aspects and contextual factors, specific areas of disabilities (sensory - hearing and visual - and motor disabilities, learning impairments -, dyslexia, dysorthography, dyscalculia - and learning difficulties at school age, the attention deficit and hyperactivity disorder -ADHD-, autism syndrome)

Objectives

At the end of the course, the student will be able: - to understand the conceptual evolution of the concept of disability - to be informed about developmental disorders from early childhood to school age - to valorize the emphasis of a multi-dimensional perspective of development which highlight the interactional aspects of genetic and bio-psycho-social features - to be aware of interventions that can be used in educational practice.
