Course title

How you become who you are

Topics and course structure

Addressing the themes of family education and educational work with families, the course intends to read from a pedagogical point of view the second debut of <u>sexuality</u> in adolescence. "How do you become who you are" is not a question that has a unique answer but the program of an adventure that everyone will carry out alone by separating themselves from family.

The lessons will provide some basic psychoanalytic notions related to the Aedipus in S. Freud and J. Lacan (in particular) ensuring, however, a solid pedagogical reconsideration.

Objectives

The lessons include:

- · providing knowledge about adolescence as a historical object;
- · to illustrate the main models of interpretation and explanation through which adolescence has been read and read today;
- · to legitimize a pedagogical point of view on adolescence in order to base educational work with adolescents in a

professional sense.

In addition, the student is intended to train the following skills:

- · the social and cultural representations, theoretical models of yesterday's and today's adolescence;
- · the information that can be analysed pedagogically by intervention aimed at adolescents;
- · to design experiences, operational tools and pedagogical intervention styles with today's teenagers.

Methodologies

They will propose:

- · moments of lesson;
- · readings and/or commentary on significant lyrics/songs;
- · watching significant movies or scenes:
- · clinical exercises to analyse and rework personal and group educational experience.

Online and offline teaching materials

They will be uploaded to the virtual classroom: articles, short texts, images, music... in reference to the lessons of the course; all this material is useful both for those who attend and for those who can not or want not to do so, for the purpose of preparation for the exam.
