Course title

Moral Philosophy: City, World, Cosmos

Topics and course structure

Philosophy in its archaic sense, as the art of life. The issue of human nature and the human condition. Exploration of possible worlds. Relationship between politics and cosmology.

Developing: 1) reading and interpretive abilities; 2) capacity for autonomous articulation; 3) critical and dialectical skills; 4) self-awareness and formative abilities; 5) listening and dialogical ability in pedagogical/analytical context.
