Course title

Chinese 1

Topics and course structure

Introduction to Chinese language.

The course aims at introducing students to both written and spoken Chinese starting from the basic elements of the language:

Characters' classification and writing

Chinese phonology

Pinyin transcription system

How to use paper dictionaries

The course will also touch upon basic grammatical features of the language.

Practice of basic-level listening and speaking skills. Students will be introduced to reading and translating simple texts.

During the second semester, students will also be trained in the reading and translation of adapted HSK2-level

newspaper articles.

Programme and references for attending students

Modern Chinese language

This first year course emphasizes writing in both characters and pinyin (phonetic system). Moreover, it serves as an introduction to basic grammar structures.

Chinese characters writing exercises, reading comprehension and basic translation techniques.

The course will also provide guidelines to reading and translating very simple texts. At the end of the course, students will be able to introduce themselves and ask basic personal questions, reading basic texts and searching for characters they do not know.

Programme and references for non-attending students

Students who, for special reasons, wish to follow a special program for the oral exam (the written part remains the same for everyone) are required to contact the lecturer via email at least one month before the exam.

Assessment methods

Students shall sit for a written (grammar and translation test) and an oral exam (oral production and comprehension, reading comprehension, translation skills, grammar).
