Course title

JAPANESE LANGUAGE 1

Topics and course structure

The Japanese language 1 course is aimed at students of the Bachelor of Science in Intercultural Communication who have no knowledge of the Japanese language, and aims to provide the foundation for learning the written and spoken language.

The course is supported by language conversation classes held by a Japanese professor.

Objectives

Knowledge and understanding

Students will gain a solid and systematic knowledge of the fundamentals of the Japanese language at an elementary level.

Ability to apply knowledge and understanding

Students will learn to rework autonomy grammatical structures and vocabulary learned during the course of the program, as well as to recognize and read a sufficient number of kanji for the understanding of texts written in the Japanese language at an elementary level.

With regard to the independence of judgment and the strengthening of communication skills, teachers urge students to formulate their own opinion independently. The ability to learn is stimulated through active participation in lectures and discussion of the materials provided by the teachers.
Methodologies
Ex cathedra teaching
In the Covid-19 emergency period, lessons will tale place in a mixed mode: partial presence and asynchronous and synchroninous videotaped lessons. The asynchroninous videotaped lessons will be loaded on e-learning before the hour of the lessons, the synchronous lessons within the next day.
Online and offline teaching materials
Online materials: exercices and articles uploaded on e-learning
Programme and references for attending students
The program includes the analysis of some aspects of grammar such as the pronunciation, the minimum sentence, conjugation of verbs and adjectives, sentence structure etc During the course, in addition, the student will read texts of various kinds. This will allow students to approach the elements of writing - ideograms and syllabic alphabets - as well as expressive forms and structures typical of written language. The lectures will be supplemented by classes with a native speaker teacher. For the exam, the students must know and read all the words and kanji included in the textbook. And should be able to write all the <i>kaku kanji</i> explained in the textbook.

Assessment methods

Written and Oral tests (both compulsory)

- Written test consists on a kanji test, grammar exercises, a translation from Japanese into Italian
- The students who pass the written exam will be admitted to the oral exam, which is composed by: translation of dokkai and questions about Japanese grammar, self-presentation, a brief conversation on various aspects of everyday life, kanji writing.
- To pass the exam, the student must get a sufficient grade in the written and in oral tests.
- The written and oral exams can be done in different months (from June 2022 to February 2023),

Evaluation methods

The ability of the students to use actively the elements of Japanese language of the course; the ability to read and write the kanji; the ability to comprehend written and oral texts; the ability to communicate in Japanese; the knowledge of Japanese grammar linguistics of the books indicated in the bibliography; the ability to translate simple texts from Japanese into Italian and viceversa.
