Course title

Modernity and consumption: needs, wishes, and politics

Topics and course structure

The program consists of a thematic part and a general one.

General part: a guided tour through the main events of the modern age, focusing on the social, political, economic and cultural features and institutions that originated between the XVI and the XIX century and that are deeply connected to the contemporary world.

Objectives

The general path and the thematic path interplay, pursuing shared objectives.

The teaching, in its dual path, aims at inspiring an understanding of the contemporary world in a diachronic key with regards to its socio-cultural, political, institutional, and economic factors.
