Course title

On Love ad philosophical and pedagogical category.

Topics and course structure

A contemporary philosopher said that love is a unique experience based on difference rather than identity, an experience that, precisely in the singularity of its occurrence, refers to something universal. What does it mean, when it comes to love, to refer to singularity and universality? When we talk about love, what kind of knowledge are we looking at? And finally, what kind of relationship and formation are we talking about when we refer to love? The course aims to introduce and deepen some of the most significant moments of Western culture in which the notion of love was conceptualized, with particular regard to its possible cognitive declinations and those inherent in affective training.

Objectives

With this teaching, with constant and participatory attendance at lessons, we intend to promote learning in terms of:

Ability to put in relation different expertises and models

Ability to apply knowledge and models

The teaching will be divided into two parts.

The first part of the course will focus on the notion of affectivity in general. Within this theoretical framework, particular attention will be paid to the notion of delirium and the relationship between emotion and childhood.

The second part of the course will be divided into two parts: one part will be dedicated to the reading and analysis of Plato's *Symposium*; the second part will be dedicated to some of the most suggestive interpretations that have been given in the French context, in particular, those of Jacques Lacan, Alain Badiou and Michel Foucault. The teaching related to Michel Foucault will be conducted by Prof. Mario Vergani.
