Learning objectives

The course consists of the modules: INDUSTRIAL AND COMPETITION ECONOMICS and ENVIRONMENT ECONOMICS. The aim of the course is to provide the student with a modern vision of industrial economics. In the first module of the course, the analysis tools of industrial economics are considered within the new framework of protection of competition provided by the regulatory and regulatory framework of the European Union. The first objective is to provide the student with a framework of reference on the main lines of operation of the markets and protection of competition to complete the training course in business management administration. The second objective is to accompany the student in understanding the effects on the production fabric of the new EU environmental policies both with reference to policies on sustainability and decarbonisation of the economy and with reference to policies for the circular economy.
