Prerequisites

Participation in the exam of 'Criminal Law. Special Part' requires the prior passing of the exam of the basic course 'Criminal Law' (Academic Regulations a.y. 2022-2023).

Teaching methods

Description of rules and principles and their ratio; case by law approach, aiming to verify comprehension and problem solving capacities.

Assessment methods

Interim examination Elaboration, exposition and classroom discussion of a legal advice (team activity for attending students).

Final oral examination to check preparation on the examination programme.

In particular, the following will be assessed: the ability to refer to the arguments in a manner appropriate to the specificities of the subject and according to correct logical-systematic canons, the ability to link the various criminal law institutions, exegetical correctness, argumentative skills, technical-expressive skills, abstract and practical reasoning skills, and the ability to work in a team.

Attending students prepare the oral exam on the topics indicated in the "Extended Programme" under points 1, 2, 3 and, at their choice, 4 (Crimes against property) or 5 (Crimes against public administration).
