Learning objectives

The course aims at providing a basic knowledge of crimes against person.

Contents

The course focuses on crimes against person through a case law method.

Detailed program

The following thematic areas will be analyzed:

- 1. Protection of life and physical integrity (murder, injuries, crimes against public safety; drugs).
- 2. Protection of personal freedom (reduction or maintenance in slavery, trafficking, kidnapping).
- 3. Protection of moral freedom (private violence, stalking, torture).
- 4. Protection of sexual dignity and freedom (sexual violence and abuse, protection of sexual privacy, prostitution, protection of minors against sexual exploitation).
- 5. Protection of personal dignity (defamation, anti-discrimination rules).
- 6. Protection of domicile, secrecy and confidentiality.
- 7. Protection within the family (mistreatment, abuse of means of correction).

Prerequisites

Knowledge of Constitutional Law (students must have passed the exam of Constitutional Law).

Teaching methods

The course will be held with face-to-face classes. There will be a live streaming link on e-learning platform for those who can't attend face-to-face classes.

Other learning opportunities will be provided on the elearning platform.

The course will have an important practical dimension: the study of criminal institutions and rules will be matched by the discussion of case-law.

Assessment methods

Oral exam, inclusive of module A and module B.

Students attending the lessons and taking part on the activities proposed during the course, including working groups, will receive a final evaluation which may permit them to avoid the oral exam.
