Learning objectives

The course aims to provide students with the knowledge of the main institutions of private law, with both a

theoretical and practical-applicative approach and with attention to the legal phenom enon in its complexity and

constant evolution. The study will also be enriched by the analysis of practical juri sprudential cases that will be $\[\frac{1}{2} \]$

addressed in the classroom with a dialogic method.

Contents

The course deals with the study of the main institutions of inheritance and family law, the theory of property and real rights.

Detailed program

As for the law of succession: regulation of legitimate and testamentary successions, division and donations. As for the right of persons and of the family: discipline of kinship and affinity; of marriage and civil union; of filiation; adoption; parental responsibility; of protection and emancipation; of affiliation and custody; of the property regime; of food. As for the real rights: discipline of the goods, of the property, of the surface, of the emphyteusis, of the usufruct, of the use, of the dwelling, of the predial easements, of communion, of possession and relative protections.

Prerequisites

The course of Institutions of private law, being placed in the first year, does not require particular prerequisites.

Teaching methods

The course is divided into lectures. Attendance is strongly recommended.

Assessment methods

Oral exam. Absence of intermediate tests. Interview both on the topics covered, and on the topics not covered in class and deepened on the textbook.
