Course title

Didactics of Literature (a.a. 2022-23)

Topics and course structure

The course, aimed at helping students to recognize and develop the educational potential of literary education, is divided into two phases, closely related to each other, on the experience of reading (aloud and silent) and that of writing (which will be explored in different forms, from prose fiction writing to poetry, including hybrid narrative forms which use also non-verbal language such as iconic language).

Specific subject of discussion will be: current status and prospects of experimental and theoretical research; practices of reading, storytelling, discussion on the texts; strategies approach to written production; the criteria to be followed both in the choice of materials and in the selection, management and evaluation of activities.

Objectives

- Awareness of the formative potential of literary education in nursery and primary school;
- knowledge and understanding of the methods and the most effective strategies for designing and conducting didactical projects of reading and discussion of texts and of creative writing.

Methodologies

Lectures, discussions, exercises.

If the health emergency situation will prevent from holding lectures in attendance, will be used the Webex platform, already tested in the past semester, to hold the lectures synchronously in the times established by the calendar (which will be recorded and uploaded to the site), preserving small and large group working methods, which are essential to experiment concretely the knowledge and teaching strategies presented.
