## **Assessment methods**

The final exam is oral.

The candidate must demonstrate a good knowledge of the key private law institutes and the Civil Code. A preliminary mnemonic study of the basic notions and definitions is also required. Institutions of private law must be presented with accurate terminology. The student must be able to explain the rules and problems that pertain to the main institutes of private law.

Prof. Emilio Tosi and Dr. Giorgia Tassoni are component of the same examination board, so that each Student is called for a unique test on Private Law without any subdivision into modules.
