Learning objectives

The course provides students with basics concepts of the constitutional law and leads them to a complete knowledge of the text of the Italian Constitution.

The course also aims to provide students with essential principles of Private Labour Law.

Contents

The main subject of the course is the Italian Constitutional Law (fundamental rights protection and public powers' organization), seen also in the perspective of European integration.

The part of labour law takes into account the rules of the employment contract.

Detailed program

Constitutional law: 1. Introduction. The State as a legal system and its forms. 2. The Italian Constitution: birth, implementation, revision. 3. The system of the sources of law. 4. The international and european dimension of the sources of law. 5. The exercise of popular sovereignty: representative and direct democracy. 6. The forms of government. 7. The constitutional organisation: Government, President of the Republic, Parliament, Constitutional Court, Judiciary. 8. Rights of freedom: individual (personal, of domicile, of movement, of expression, of religion) and collective (assembly and association). 10. The Economic Constitution.

Labour Law: 1. Subordinate and autonomous works. 2. Employees' duties. 3. Employer's powers. 4. Working time. 5. The wage. 6. Dismissal and redundancies. 7. Atypical work.

Prerequisites

Knowledge of the Italian language.

Teaching methods

Lectures

Assessment methods

Two compulsory written tests (one for each of the two parts) comprising a test with closed questions and open questions; optional oral (for those who have achieved a pass in the written part).
