Contents

The course aims to support the acquisition of fundamental knowledge about the theory and technique of psychological interview.

Starting from the different areas of use of the instrument, will be present the typologies of interview and the instruments and the interview techniques (listening, observation and techniques of the question), particularly in the

clinical context. A specific attention will be given to the issue of the relationship with the patient and to the formulation of clinical hypothesis on the case.

A monographic part will be focused on conducting the interview according a cognitive-behavioral approach.

Prerequisites

Nothing specific. A good knowledge of the basis of Psychology enables a more aware use of the course contents.

Teaching methods

In addition to classroom lectures, part of the teaching will take place through the discussion of case studies and audio material.

The material (slides and, when possible, scientific articles) is made available on the e-learning site of the course, so that it can also be used by non-attending stud

Assessment methods

The exam is written, and includes 10 multiple choice questions (maximum score 10) and two open-ended questions (maximum score 20), covering the general and monographic portions of the course . The final score is given by the sum of the two tests.

The questions are intended to ascertain the effective theoretical knowledge of the students.

The evaluation criteria are: the correctness of the answers and the critical knowledge of the learned concepts.

For those students who request it, an oral interview is also provided, on all the topics of the course, which can lead to an increase or decrease of up to 2 points compared to the score of the written exam.

No “in itinere” examinations are scheduled.
