#### Contents

After an introductory part, in which the concept of intelligence, its different forms, various models theory and the history of testing, we will move on to the practical part. The methods of administering the tests will be explained.

WISC-IV and Leiter-R and the cautions to be used. The individual subtests will be presented thoroughly, also making use of their constituent materials and video recordings of children. Students will also be involved in role-playing exercises to better learn how to handle the material and administer it.

## **Prerequisites**

## **Teaching methods**

Presentation of content related to the subject matter, watching movies on test administration, exercises on how to assign scores and fill out a protocol, role-playing on administering test scales.

## **Assessment methods**

Compulsory attendance at least 75 percent of the classes (12 hours out of 16) is required. Students will be required to administer 4 subtests of the WISC-IV scale to two subjects and produce a short written paper, indicating the characteristics of the administration, the scores obtained by the subjects tested and an overall evaluation of the experience.
