Aims

Provide the nursing student with specific knowledge on the particularity assistance to the patient suffering from onco-haematological diseases, starting from an in-depth study of the clinic, moving on to therapeutic procedures such as chemotherapy and stem cell transplantation, deepening the relational aspects

- 1. The care approach to the haematological patient starting from an analysis of the organizational context.
- 2. The particular fragility of the assisted persons.
- 3. The main pathologies

Detailed program

- · Introduction of the organizational context of Hematology department;
- Description of the particular characteristics and needs of the assisted person;
- The illnesses involved;
- Nursing assistance to the main diagnostic and therapeutic procedures (bone marrow aspirate; bone biopsy; medicated rachicentesis; therapeutic apheresis)
- Bone marrow transplant (allogeneic and autologous);
- · communication and relationship with the patient's relatives
- · Psychological support for family patients and caregivers.
- The end of life event as a result or complication of the disease;
- Taking charge of the patient after discharge
