Learning objectives

The student's ability to orient themselves within the existing legislation in the different government levels: International, European, national and regional, and the ability to interpret the rules for application purposes.

Contents

concept of landscape; The foundation of both concepts in the Italian Constitution; Cultural property and activities in the legal system currently in force (above all in the Urbani Code); Traditional commercial activity and protection of the old/historical town centres; Cultural property and activities in the European Union Law.

Detailed program

After a brief historical-institutional outline of the Italian cultural heritage, the fundamental aspects of the subject are addressed, with themes ranging from the concepts of a cultural artefact or cultural property, including the landscape as heritage and the related activities (protection and enhancement) to rules and regulations applied to the cultural heritage in present-day Italian and European Union law.

Teaching methods

Classroom lectures with powerpoint presentations.
