

## SYLLABUS DEL CORSO

### Demografia e Turismo

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#### Learning objectives

The course has two distinct objectives. The first is to deepen the current demographic dynamics. The second objective is pursued by assuming these dynamics as determinants of tourist flows' intensity and quality. Since the course has an empirical approach, workgroups are formed in order to analyze demographic topics through national and international materials and data.

#### Detailed program

The course has two objectives. The first is deepening current demographic dynamics by providing the tools to assess and interpret the manifestations and causes of territorial differentiation of demographic processes. In particular, population issues are illustrated by comparing the demographic conditions of advanced economic

development countries with poor countries. This allows us to fully highlight the similarities and differences in historical and contemporary demographic processes that characterize the world's areas. The second objective is pursued by assuming these dynamics as determinants of the intensity and quality of tourist flows. In particular, the economic and social conditions of the various countries will be linked to the tourism phenomenon as a whole. The training activity foresees a constant reference to the applicative approaches of the topics dealt with through data and materials available at the national and international levels.
