## COURSE SYLLABUS

### Adolescence Education

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#### Course title

Adolescence, "middle-earth". Educational work and pedagogical reflection

#### Topics and course structure

The course, after broadening the gaze to the literary imagination and to the knowledge of the human and social sciences, intends to address the theme of adolescence from a pedagogical and educational point of view.

A first group of lessons will be dedicated to focusing on the object-adolescence both historically and structurally to arrive at a pedagogical definition of adolescence as "Middle-earth" (Barone, Mantegazza, 1999).

We will then move on to describe the quality of life of contemporary adolescents.

At the end, educational work in services with adolescents will be addressed.

#### Objectives

The lessons include:

- to provide knowledge about adolescence as a historical but also structural object ;
- to illustrate the main interpretative and explanation models through which it has been read and is read today adolescence ;
- to legitimize a pedagogical point of view on adolescence to found educational work with the adolescents in a professional sense.

In addition, lessons intended to train the student in the following skills:

- to be able to recognize social and cultural representations, theoretical models of adolescence ;
- to know how to pedagogically analyze the contexts of intervention aimed at adolescents ;

-to know how to design experiences, operational tools and styles of pedagogical intervention with today's adolescents.

## **Methodologies**

They will propose: moments of lesson; reading and/or commentary of significant texts/passages; watching significant movies or scenes; clinical exercises.

## **Online and offline teaching materials**

They will be uploaded to the virtual classroom: articles, short texts, images, music... in reference to the lessons of the course.

## **Assessment methods**

- the critical ability and construction of an original discourse also in relation to future professionalism.
